the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his.”

3. In 2 Timothy 1:14 we read, **“That good thing which was committed unto thee keep by the Holy Ghost which dwelleth in us.”**
- F. The Holy Spirit is our “gift” from God to liberate us from the power of sin and death.
 1. What we see here is the added dimension of our “gift” of the Holy Spirit operating His power in our practical lives.
 2. In Romans 8:1-2 we read, **“There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus.....For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.”**
 - a. Here the Holy Spirit (our gift) develops inside each believer their freedom from the law of sin and death.
 3. In Ephesians 3:16 we again see our “gift” working in our lives: **“That He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man.”**
 - a. Here the Holy Spirit (our gift) manifests strength in our inner man.
 4. In Ephesians 1:19 we read, **“And what is the exceeding greatness of His power to us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power.”**
 - a. All of His works inside the believer are the result of the working of His mighty power.

“THE HOLY SPIRIT – OUR HELP”

- III. We will continue looking at the inner and outer works of the Holy Spirit as he helps each and every believer be all they can be.
 - A. As I have already stated, the Holy Spirit works inside the believer doing marvelous works on behalf of God with the believer, and He also manifests through the believer causing them to do great service for God in behalf for other people.

“THE MANIFESTATIONS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT”

1. All of this is made possible by God “gifts” to the believer as told in Acts 2:38 AMP: **“And Peter answered them, Repent (change your views and purpose to accept the will of God in your inner selves instead of rejecting it) and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of and release from your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.”**
2. The Holy Spirit as our “gift” makes possible all forms of **“*communion*”** with God.
3. PRAYER:
 - a. Jude 20 says, **“But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost.”**
 - b. Romans 8:26 says, **“Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities; for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.”**
4. WORSHIP:
 - a. Philippians 3:3 says, **“For we are the circumcision, which worship God in the spirit, and rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh.”**
 - b. John 4:23-24 states: **“But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship Him. God is a Spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth.”**
 - c. Another inside work of the Holy Spirit (our gift) in us is a spirit of worship.
5. SPIRITUAL SINGING:
 - a. In Colossians 3:16 we read: **“Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your**

hearts to the Lord.”

- b. In Corinthians 14:15 the Scripture states: **“What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also: I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also.”**
- B. Our “gift” of the Holy Spirit gives **“guidance”** for our life and ministry.
 1. In Romans 8:14 we are told: **“For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.”**
 2. In John 16: 13 we are told: **“Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself; but whatsoever He shall hear, that shall He speak; and He will show you things to come.”**
- C. Our “gift”, the Holy Spirit brings about the **“quickenning”** of our bodies at the resurrection.
 1. Romans 8:11 says, **“But if the Spirit of Him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you.”**
 - a. The word “quicken” here means “to make alive.”
 2. We also read in 2 Corinthians 3:18: **“But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord.”**
- D. The Holy Spirit as our “gift” **equips** the believer for service through manifestation.
 1. In Acts 1:8 we read: **“But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto Me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.”**
 - a. Here in this verse we see God’s power flowing to us through our “gift” of the Holy Spirit and His manifestations.

2. In 1 Corinthians 12:7-11 we read: **“But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. “V8, For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another, the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; V9, To another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, the gifts of healing by the same Spirit; V10, To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another, discerning of spirits; to another, various kinds of tongues; to another, the interpretation of tongues: V11, But all these worketh that one and the very same Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will.”**
 - a. The power of God is available through our “gift” the Holy Spirit in nine different “manifestations” of power.

“EXERCISING OUR SPIRITUAL POWER”

- IV. In this teaching I have made it plain and profound, each Christian has God’s “gift” of the Holy Spirit.
 - A. Therefore, each Christian has spiritual “power” and should be exercising that power.
 1. It’s important that we as believers remember that Jesus said that when the Holy Spirit came, believers would have power.
 - a. In Acts 1:8 AMP: **“But you shall receive power (ability, efficiency, and might) when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you shall be My witnesses in Jerusalem and all Judea and Samaria and to the ends (the very bounds) of the earth.”**
 2. This would be a good point in our study to ask the question; what is the power Jesus was speaking of?
 - a. I believe it is the power to hear from God, to speak in tongues, prophesy, do signs, miracles, and wonders, and much more.
 - b. In short, we can bring into evidence, into manifestation, the “gift” of the Holy Spirit inside us.
 3. The “gift” of the Holy Spirit, is the divine nature of God, and is sealed in
